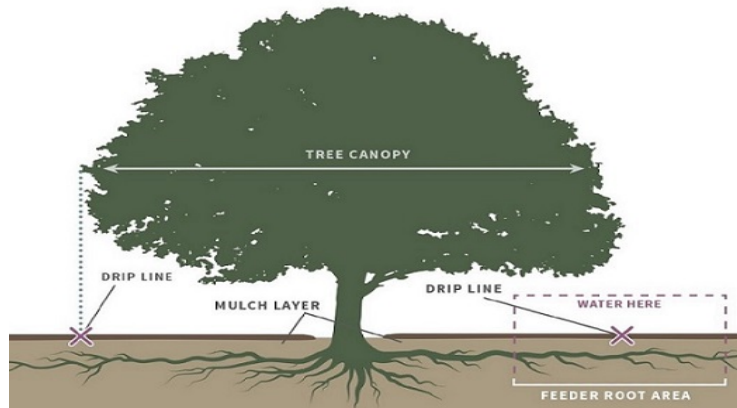


When to Water Your Trees



Mature trees: Water to approximately 5" to 6" of saturation as needed (see tables below) from the tree trunk to the dripline (see diagram above) You will know how to achieve saturation level by experimenting with watering times. First by timing your sprinkler system and checking depth of saturation. Use a garden spade or other means of digging through the first 6 inches of soil after two hours of watering. If depth is not reached, check every hour until reached. Mark your time and use for future reference.

Newly planted trees: it is best to follow the instructions on the watering table with the use of a Gator Bag.

Watering table for Mature trees

70 degrees = once a week
80 degrees = twice a week
90 degrees = three times a week
100 + degrees = every day



Watering Table for newly planted trees

70 degrees = every third day
80 degrees = every second day
90 degrees = every day
Watering bags are to be placed on trees during the watering season: mid May through the end of October and must be placed annually for the first 3 years from planting
